It is important to recognize that our efforts have not been isolated —even though we ourselves have been forcibly isolated during most of this endeavor. There have been MANY sewers and quilters responding to the need for masks simultaneously around the country and around the Capital Region. I cannot begin to quantify all that has been done even in our own region, because so much was not coordinated —or counted — by anyone. However, I can tell you that we coordinated with, delivered masks to, supported, shared elastic (that oh-so-valuable commodity!) with our sister guilds and colleagues in this effort.

Quilters of the Gloversville/Johnstown/Amsterdam area coordinated by Diana Marshall of the Gloversville Sewing Center, sewers of the Mooncatcher Project coordinated by Elle Von Wellsheim and we, the people of QUILTSchenectady, have made and distributed well over 30,000 masks!

To answer some inevitable questions...

We have a small backlog/stockpile of masks to fill any straggling requests that may yet come in. Of course we hope that as the lockdowns ease, we do not see any new outbreaks anywhere in the country, especially here. But we will be ready if shortages occur again. If you are currently making masks, please finish what you have started and furnish them to our Hub Manager, Felicia Campo as before. We ask Hub Captains and Drivers to stay attached to this effort for a couple of weeks more to wind up this effort, with the expectation that fewer masks will be funneling in.

We intend to contact EVERYONE to whom masks were given, reminding them that these are washable and reusable. And when wearing them is no longer necessary, the masks should be washed and SAVED for any future unfortunate outbreak. I am sure I am not

alone in feeling that we don't want to do this all over again —in any way!! I urge all of you who have made them for friends and family to make a similar suggestion.

NEXT STEPS

Now, as you are certainly wondering, what will we be doing as a Guild since we are rather indefinitely shut down for an unspecified time? We canNOT yet guess WHEN we will be able to meet again —as we all deeply long for "normal" to return. We will all be watching carefully as various places open up over the months to come. Their success or failure will inform decisions by our Governor about when we will be permitted to safely gather again. Although I cannot tell you WHEN, I can tell you a little bit about HOW we will have our first "post-Covid" meeting. We will not have a speaker but we will definitely have Show and Tell for the wonderful creations you have completed during and AFTER MASKS! And we will have a MASSIVE PARTY to which I hope every one of you will come, as well as our colleagues who have worked alongside of us in this great effort.

With you, I long for that day. The lyrics, to Rogers and Hammerstein's *You'll Never Walk Alone*, come to mind. "At the end of the storm there's a golden sky and the sweet silver song of a lark."

Have an amazing summer: You deserve it!
