For our block of the month challenge start with a white on white print 8 1/2 inch square cut 20 different color batik of 2 1/2 inch squares

Border 2 opposite sides with 4 of the 2 1/2 inch squares so no two colors touch Border the remaining 2 opposite sides with 6 of the 2 1/2 inch squares so no two colors touch Your finished block should measure 12 1/2 inches
