After a pandemic-related hiatus of several months, **Emily Spooner**, Our Kid's Quilt Chairwoman Extraordinaire, reports...

"Northern Rivers came and picked up 14 bags of quilts this week. That's about 60 quilts. I was thrilled. They were thrilled. I have about 20 left, but I'm still sewing so there will be more. Nancy Calkins has 12 that she is machine quilting...

Also, the holiday giving program is being organized now. I was told that they are going to allow organizations to adopt a residential group and buy things from the wish list for those specific kids. Gifts would be ordered on amazon from their online wishlist, and mailed directly to Northern Rivers. They will also be doing things the "old/usual" way, which is similar, but not child specific. They will still have their "store" where community parents can come in to shop from whatever is there. This is where our in-kind gifts have gone in the past."

We are suggesting that you continue to make kids quilts as you always have so generously done. But keep them at your house until we can arrange the next pick up with Northern Rivers who is handling acquiring them differently than before due to Covid-19.
