#### THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE

At our October meeting, Bonnie Turner from Log Cabin Fabrics in Selkirk, NY, joined us to talk about embellishing quilts. She shared many examples of her work, embellished with beads, embroidery stitches, flower pounding, lace and other materials, and dimensional thread painting.

We will be able to learn more about dimensional thread painting when Joyce Hughes joins us from Pennsylvania for her lecture on this topic at our January 6<sup>th</sup> guild meeting. We'll then have an opportunity to practice it ourselves at Joyce's six-hour virtual workshop on **Saturday, January 8<sup>th</sup>**.



In this class we will use a beautiful daisy and butterfly panel, included in the workshop fee of \$65.00, to learn the proper steps of dimensional thread painting. Joyce explains that we will find it to be a fun and creative technique that we can do on our domestic machines. We'll explore thread selection and learn to properly set up our machines for free motion quilting techniques using zigzag and straight stitching. Joyce will cover shading, highlighting and when to add additional detail and definition. We will use thread as paint and sew with different types of threads and color combinations, creating interesting textures and dimensions to our quilting project. At the end of this sixhour workshop we will have a full knowledge of dimensional thread painting, having created a one-of-a-kind 15 3/4" x 15" piece of art!

Members will need a free motion or darning foot and their machine and foot must be able to do zigzag stitches. This project will use 17 different threads. Mettler item numbers and color descriptions are included on the supply list. You may buy Mettler thread on your own or use other brands. However, Joyce has also put together a kit of Mettler thread in the appropriate colors and weights. This optional kit is \$40.00, with the threads being deeply discounted, and can be ordered when you register through Q.U.I.L.T.S. Joyce will cover the shipping costs of the fabric panel and thread kit for people registering by December 17<sup>th</sup>. Members may register up until December 25<sup>th</sup> but will need to order the kits directly from Joyce and pay shipping.

In February, we'll get tiny with Kellie Willey of California. The topic of her lecture at our February 3<sup>rd</sup> guild meeting will be Miniature Quilts. Then on **Saturday, February 5<sup>th</sup>**, over the course of a six-hour virtual workshop, we will learn the easy steps for making this fun mini quilt with a variety of scraps or a 5" charm pack. Kellie will teach us design and piecing techniques and demonstrate how to quilt our finished tops in a modern way. She will also show us how to make a

smaller binding that fits the size of our projects. We will leave class with a completed, ready to quilt top.
