Hello quilters! Mary has been hard at work researching speakers and workshop teachers for the 2023 – 2024 calendar year. Our **September 7**th meeting will feature the first presenter, Diane Podesva,

owner of Diane's Quilted Square (formerly the Quiltbug). She will talk about her new shop and the programs available there. She will also tell us about the fabrics she is carrying and what is coming in the near future. She will bring fabric for purchase. The next day, Friday, **September 8**^a, Diane will sponsor a workshop on wool appliqué taught by Q.U.I.L.T.S. member Paula Ross. There will be two different fall theme kits for purchase for the workshop. The cost of the kit is \$35.00. There isn't a fee for the workshop. The kit will include everything needed for the workshop. Paula suggests that members taking the workshop bring the usual sewing items not included: scissors, marking pen or pencil, pins, Elmer's Purple Glue Stick and magnification, if needed. Straight from the heart quilts for kids

To date, members have donated a total of 61 finished quilts along with 30+ tops that need to be sandwiched, quilted & bound. We will be scheduling a machine quilting day to move these quilts along where members can learn/sharpen their walking foot machine quilting skills. Stay tuned. We would also greatly appreciate any person who quilts using a long arm to take a top to finish.

Our annual sew-in is scheduled for **Thursday**, **November 2nd**. In addition to already cut kits we will have yardage you may choose from to use in making your favorite pattern. Food and beverages will be served for those who arrive at 4pm to begin sewing. Additional details to follow.

As you may recall, following the last tie-in it was discovered that several quilts were not tied securely, as in the ties were not 4" apart, necessitating additional work by guild members. Because this happens often enough, and the quilts donated tend to be washed frequently by recipients, a decision has been made that **WE WILL NO LONGER BE** **TYING QUILTS THAT WILL BE DONATED TO NORTHERN RIVERS**. Quilts donated will need to be secured more thoroughly by machine or hand quilting so that they hold up to frequent washing and last longer. Our annual tie-in will be replaced by another social event focused on

finishing these quilts which may include a workshop on machine or hand quilting techniques. Again, stay tuned.

As a reminder, we donate a majority of our quilts to Northern Rivers. They

provide a wide range of services to families with children of all ages. Currently, there are as many girls as boys in their programs. At this time there is a high need for preteen to teenage quilts. Please try to choose fabrics that are as gender neutral as possible. Finished quilts should measure $54 \times 72^{\circ}$.

Interested in making the Show Raffle Quilt? This quilt is a big part of guild fund-raising supporting guest speakers and activities. We need a volunteer or Friendship Group to complete a queensized quilt top. The guild covers the cost of all materials and pays for custom long-arm quilting. The Raffle Quilt Chairperson (or Friendship group) completes the top, binding and hanging sleeve.

Additionally, volunteers are needed to begin planning the next show. Many Committee Chairs have agreed to continue in their positions, some



new volunteers have stepped forward, but new helpers are needed!!

Monthly meetings (mostly held by Zoom) will start in January, tentatively the first Wednesday of the month. The open positions are *Treasurer*, *Boutique*, *Catalog Layout/Design/Printing*, *assistant Show Design/Set-up of Quilts*, *Raffle Quilt*, *Raffle Tickets*, *Signage*, *Volunteer Recruiting*, *Veterans Booth*, *Odds and Ends*. Veterans' Quilts

Thank you for all the beautiful Veteran's quilts that were turned in at the June meeting. Pat McGurn and I made our inaugural visit to the VA hospital on August 9th. Pat Terry was kind enough to accompany us and show us the ropes. After more than 3 years we were able to hand deliver quilts DIRECTLY to veteran inpatients. We even got to visit floors that the guild had never had access to before. Some of these people were facing extremely difficult challenges and it filled our hearts with joy and pride to bring smiles to so many faces as they chose their favorite quilt. Patients and hospital staff alike were so grateful for our quilts. We received so many compliments on how beautiful they were. All in all, we distributed **31** quilts at the hospital and brought 6 more to the Fisher House to restock their supply. Families staying at the Fisher House may receive a quilt on behalf of their veteran. For those who are unfamiliar with the Fisher Houses, they provide military families housing near their loved ones while they are hospitalized for an illness, diseases, or injury - at no cost and for as long as they need it.

Block of the month

If you aren't able to make a whole veterans or kids quilt, this is a great way to still support our service projects. The first BOM can be picked up at the Veteran's Quilt table during the September 7th meeting. Feel free to sign out one kit or as many as you'd like.
