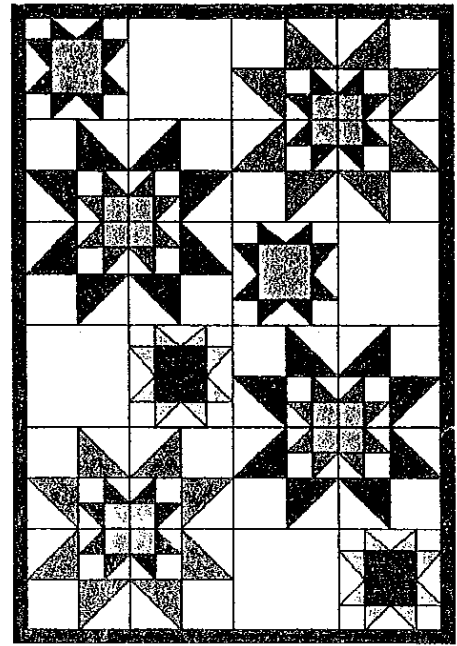


# COUNTRY STARS SCRAP QUILT

**51" X 75"**

This is a SUPER-EASY-QUICK quilt to make for Northeast Kids. It requires only 8 12" stars, with four of them enlarged into 24" stars. It can be made entirely of scraps. *(Note that directions are for single stars, with notes in parentheses for non-scrap yardage)*



Each small star requires:

**One 6.5" square for center** – 8 total for 8 stars  
(½ yard total for all 8 stars – if *not* using all scraps)

**Eight 3.5" squares for star-points** – 64 total  
(¾ yards total star-point fabric for all 8 stars)

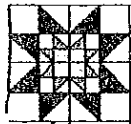
**Four 3.5" x 6.5" rectangles (background)** (32 total)  
**Four 3.5" squares for corners (background)** (32 total)  
(1 yard total background for rectangles and corners)

Sew these pieces into eight 12" stars.  
Four of the stars will now be made into four 24" stars.

To make four stars into larger stars, cut for each:

**Four 6.5" squares for corners (background)**

**One 13.25" square to cut diagonally twice into 4 quarter-square triangles (background)**  
(1.5 yards total background for the corners and the quarter-square long triangles of 4 large stars.)

**Four 6 7/8" squares to cut into eight half-square triangles.** You will sew them to the long triangles to make the large star-points. (¾ yard total for the 4 large stars).

Set the finished stars with **four 12.5" plain squares.** (¾ yard background, with some to spare).  
**Total background fabric, if using all the same background = 3 yards.**  
If you're using all scraps, just plan as you go.

Add 1.5" borders (cut-size 2" --about a half yard) – and please include an extra half-yard of one of the fabrics to make a binding.

Make star-points in quick-corner style:

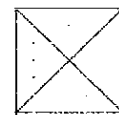
## QUICK CORNER STYLE

Mark diagonal line across squares; place on rectangle and sew on marked line. Press the square back toward corner.

Carefully trim excess fabric from the middle layer. Repeat with the second square, press and trim.
