

QUILTS FOR KIDS: EVER-RISING STAR QUILT

Each "block" (there are four horizontal divisions and six vertical divisions on this quilt) measures 12". The quilt will finish to 48" x 72" without a border.

Specific cutting instructions aren't given, since you can arrange your scraps as you please, but to help you with the cutting, following are the main measurements:

The largest triangles measure 12" to a side and can be cut 2 to a 13" square, cut diagonally. You need a total of 12 assorted large triangles, or 6 triangle/squares.

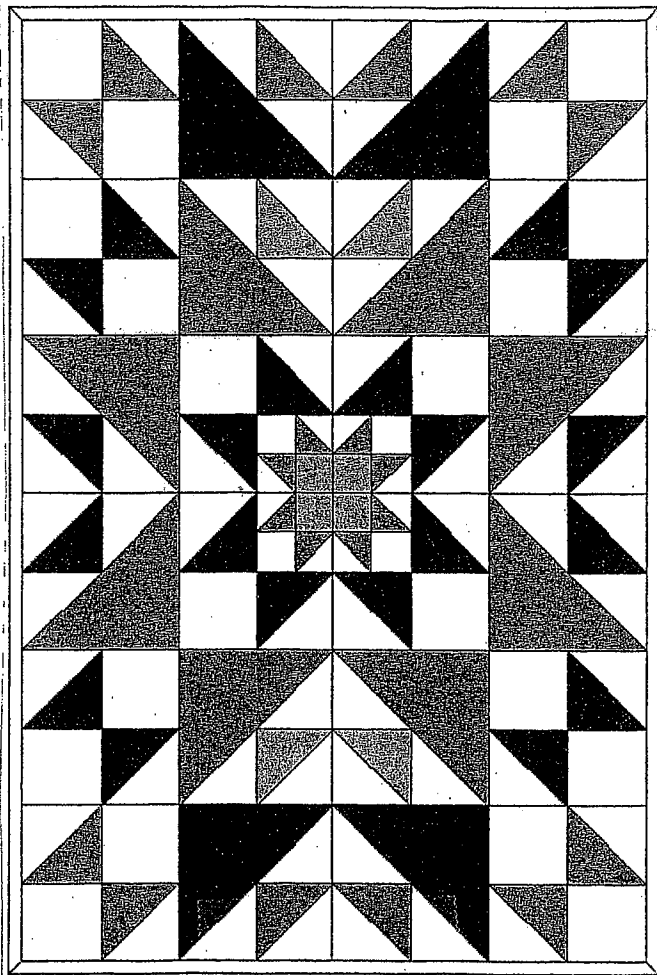
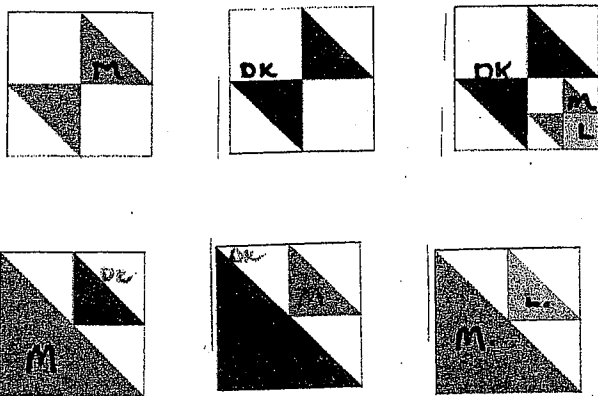
The medium triangles measure 6" to a side and can be cut 2 to a 7" square, cut diagonally. You need a total of 36 assorted medium triangles, or 18 triangle/squares.

The smallest triangles (center star only) measure 3" to a side and can be cut 2 to a 4" square. You need a total of 8 small triangles, or 4 triangle/squares.






The small center squares measure 3" (cut 3 1/2")
You need 4 of these squares.

All other squares measure 6" (cut 6 1/2").
You need 20 of these squares, all background.

Use a variety of light/medium/dark scraps for this quilt or color the diagram in the design you'd like to do. If you following the shading in the diagram, you will need four each of these six blocks and for reference, I am calling these shades dark - medium - light - and background, but these placements are your decision.



Following the diagram, you will need approx. yardage:

-  1 yard dark
-  1 yard medium
-  1/4 yard light
-  1 3/4 yard background — with only 3" leeway
-  Binding 1/2 yard (Bind in dark)
