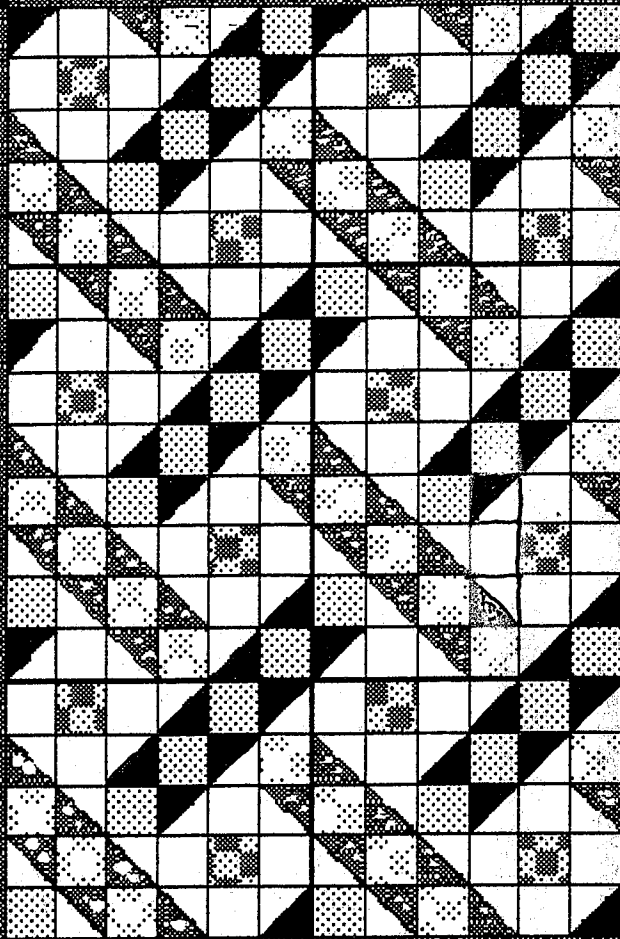
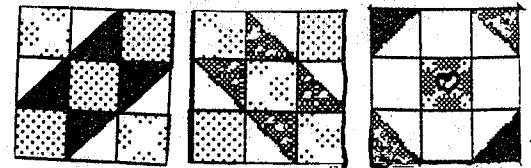


## Quilt #2



54" x 72" (triple 3" borders)

Block C

Block A uses Dark #1 triangles with Medium #1 squares down center and Medium #2 squares at opposite corners.

Block B uses Dark #2 triangles with Medium #2 squares down center and Medium #1 squares at opposite corners.

Block C uses Dark #1 and Dark #2 triangles at opposing corners, with Medium/Light square in center.

Like Quilt #1, this is also nice done with scraps in two different color families. Also like Quilt #1, triangle-squares must be trimmed to exact  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " after sewing.

Fabric: scraps or the following yardage:

Dark #1: total of  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard

Dark #2: total of  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard

Medium #1: total of  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard

Medium #2: total of  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard

Medium/Light: total of  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard

Lights: total of  $1\frac{1}{4}$  yard

Border requirements same as Quilt #1.

### TO MAKE THIS QUILT:

Dark #1: Cut 24 4" squares to make 48 triangles; use for Block A and Block C.

This takes 3 4" strips, which may be a variety of strips in the same color family; i.e., all dark greens.

Dark #2: Cut 24 4" squares to make 48 triangles; use for Block B and Block C.

This takes 3 4" strips.

Medium #1: Cut 30  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; use 18 for Block A, 12 for Block B.

This takes 3  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Medium #2: Cut 30  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; use 18 for Block B, 12 for Block A.

This takes 3  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Medium/Light: Cut 12  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; use for center of Block C.

This takes 1  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strip.

Lights: Cut 48 4" squares to make 96 triangles; use in Blocks A, B and C.

Cut 48  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; use in Block C.

This takes 5 4" strips and 5  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Make 6 each of Block A and Block B as shown in small diagrams. Make 12 of Block C. Then set the blocks together but be very careful of both the order and the direction of the blocks.
