Double 9-Patch blocks

Last month you were probably wondering why you made all of those little 9-Patch blocks if you weren't going to use all of them - well, here's where they all go.

If you didn't cut the 3 $\frac{1}{2}$:" square from Fabric B as suggested at the end of Part 3, then do that now. You will need 80 (or 40).

Now assemble your 9-Patch blocks using 5 small 9-Patches and 4 solid Fabric B squares in each block. You will be making 20 (or 9) blocks.

And now you see why this is called Double Delight! Two different square in a square units in the Rolling Star and now a Double 9-Patch.

Hint: If you press all of the seams towards the unpieced squares (even if they are the lighter fabric) you will have greater ease in assembling the quilt.
