## STEP 2

Cut $21 / 2 "$ strips from both the feature fabric(s) and background fabric. Sew these strips together in pairs and then cut $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units from the strip pieced lengths. Repeat this process to create 8 units per block you are making. Assemble these units to create 4 units measuring $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2 "$ per block.

You will have 48 completed 4-patch units if you are making 12 blocks, 24 units if you are making 6 blocks, and 16 units if you are making 4 blocks.


Remember, if you are using scraps or fat quarters, you need to use the same feature fabric for each group of 4 completed square units to create consistent blocks. If you are using fat quarters, each fat quarter can be used to create 2 blocks. Or use one fat quarter per block, with more of each left over. In either case, save the remaining fabric to include in your borders and binding.

Set your units aside until next month.
