QUILT Schenectady Mystery Quilt – 2014-15 Designed by Kathryn Greenwold

Part 2 – October

We're all busy with the show this month, so I've just planned some simple piecing which you can get caught up on later if need be.

Step 1

For each 12 ½" square of Fabric A you will need 4 half-square from Fabric B.

Using a 6 ½" square ruler or 6" x 24" ruler, mark each corner at 4 ¾" as shown in Figure 1.

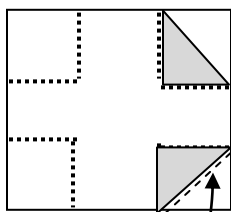

Then place one half-square of Fabric B (right side down) in each corner as shown in the upper right corner of Figure 1.

Stitch these triangles in place using a ¼" seam.

Trim away the Fabric A triangles at the edge of the Fabric B triangles as shown in the lower right corner of Figure 1. Save these triangles for your borders.

Press the Fabric B triangles out to the corners. They will be a little beyond the edges of the Fabric A square. Trim the block down to 12 ½" x 12 ½".

Large Quilt

You will need 15 of these Snowball blocks.

Small Quilt

You will need 10 of these Snowball blocks.

Step 2

Working with the remaining 60 half-square triangles of both Fabric A and Fabric B, sew them together to make squares with one of each fabric triangles. See Figure 2.

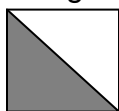

Using a 4 ½" square, trim down to 4 ½" x 4 ½".

Large Quilt

You will need 60 of these 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

Small Quilt

You will need 40 of these 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.
