## Part 2 - October

We're all busy with the show this month, so l've just planned some simple piecing which you can get caught up on later if need be.

## Step 1

For each $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square of Fabric $A$ you will need 4 half-square from Fabric $B$.
Using a $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " square ruler or 6 " x 24 " ruler, mark each corner at $43 / 4$ " as shown in Figure 1.

Then place one half-square of Fabric B (right side down) in each corner as shown in the upper right corner of Figure 1.

Stitch these triangles in place using a $1 / 4$ " seam.
Trim away the Fabric A triangles at the edge of the Fabric B triangles as shown in the lower right corner of Figure 1. Save these triangles for your borders.

Press the Fabric B triangles out to the corners. They will be a little beyond the edges of the Fabric A square. Trim the block down to $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## Large Quilt

You will need 15 of these Snowball blocks.

## Small Quilt

You will need 10 of these Snowball blocks.

## Step 2

Working with the remaining 60 half-square triangles of both Fabric $A$ and Fabric B, sew them together to make squares with one of each fabric triangles. See Figure 2.

Using a $41 / 2 "$ square, trim down to $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2 "$.

## Large Quilt

You will need 60 of these $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2 "$ squares.

## Small Quilt

You will need 40 of these $41 / 2 " \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
