Last year we initiated a series of sew-ins for Veteran quilts. It proved to be a success and we will be doing this again this year. Participants can sign up at the Guild meetings and bring machines, etc. to sew. Complete kits will be provided. Helpers are also welcome to cut, iron, etc.

Dates are Friday, Nov. 10 (a day off for Veterans' Day on Saturday), Friday, January 26 and Friday, April 27.

We passed out 67 quilts at the VA hospital this past year. This is the highest number since we began this program!

September	Red	February	Violet/ Purple
October	Orange	March	Black
November	Yellow	April	White
December	Green	May	Brown
January	Blue	June	You Pick (any fat quarter in your stash will do)
