

FROM OUR PRESIDENT:

There are 2 key positions that need to be filled this spring: the position of President and the position of Show Chair. These are separate and unrelated positions but both are key to the smooth running of our guild.

This is our guild, supported and run by us. All of us, not a few of us. There is a time for each of us to step forward and add our time and talent to the guild. You don't have to be perfect at it ... give yourself the opportunity to stretch yourself. There are many former presidents, show chairs, and committee members who are glad to guide you. Have a serious conversation with yourself and ask yourself if this is the time when you can step forward and take on some new responsibility. I took the risk and grew from it. You just might enjoy it ⁽²⁾

The **President's** role is mostly as a coordinator of the general operation of the guild, answering questions, directing traffic, chairing the board meetings, making sure everyone knows what is going on, and occasionally, making a decision.

The **Show Chair's** job is to act as coordinator of the show. Again, guiding the direction, answering questions, working with Proctors, making sure all the committees have the info and direction they need, and making sure everyone is singing from the same song sheet. Many of you have been through the process of putting a wedding together. The show is similar – certain things done early on (venue, date, etc.), some things done along the way (hire judges, line up vendors, generate publicity), and finally, things done closer to the event (registration, setup, and the event itself). We have a good show committee – a number of seasoned committee members as well as good coaching for new committee members bringing new blood to the show. We have good records and information to follow. We just need an organized person (preferably a 2 people working together) to coordinate the effort. Without a show chair, there is no show. Without the show, there is no income. Without the income...

There are some other committee positions that need filling: fat quarters, newsletter, and library.

<u>April 6th 2017 - Learning from Each Other - Demonstrations</u> (meeting at 7:00, doors open at 6:30)

Great opportunity to learn from each other. There will be 3 hands-on classes and 4 demo classes.

Hands-on classes (these will last the entire time):

- Zentangle on fabric (abstract drawing using repetitive patterns) Linda Ovitt will teach this. Supplies will be provided
- Hand Applique

Pat Piniazek will teach this. Please bring the following supplies:

- 4 dark and 4 light 7" squares and a couple of other scraps.
- Washable glue stick
- Fine applique needles, fine pins (not to long)
- Fine sewing thread, 50wt or higher
- Inexpensive watercolor paint brush.
- Pencil or other removable fabric marking tool
- Hand Quilting

Kathy Greenwold will teach this. Supplies will be provided but bring your favorite thimble.

Demos (members will be able to sample several of these):

Bowl Cozies

Kathie Lutz will demo how to make these bowl or plate shaped potholders to hold your hot dishes

- Fuse, fold, & Sew Connie Trigger will demo this method to piece with better accuracy and fewer seams to sew through the use of Quilter's Grid.
- Feather Quilting Linda Cary will demonstrate how to create feathers quilting using a domestic machine
- Stack & Whack Paula Dunn will demonstrate this method for making kaleidoscope-like blocks .

May 4th 2017 - Linda Poole (meeting at 7:00, doors open at 6:30)

Linda's expertise is painting on fabric and creating appliqued quilts. She will offer a lecture and trunk show on "Turkish Tiles – American Style" where she shows inspirations from different mediums of art, including Iznik Tiles. Check out her website at lindaMPoole.com or on You Tube.



<u>Class</u>: Wed, May 3^{rd} , 10 - 4: "Out on a Limb". Linda will instruct us in painting, blending and adding details to fabric that can be used as a whole cloth quilt (small), combined with other

blocks, or appliqued. The class fee is \$40 and there is a \$30 materials/supply fee for pattern, brushes, paints, etc.

You need to bring some simple additional supplies:

Masking or artist tape, 8.5" x 11" piece of cardboard, Pencil sharpener, Washcloth inside of plastic baggie/zip bag, small container to fill with water, pPaper towels, apron or old clothes

NOTE! Linda Poole's workshop is on <u>Wednesday</u> (the day before the guild meeting) rather than Friday. There are still some vacancies for her class. We are sharing Linda with Quilts North but the workshops and lectures will be different.

Just a reminder: a Fat Quarter measures 18x20 to 22". It is a $\frac{1}{2}$ yard of fabric, cut in half across the width of the fabric. It will be 18" in one direction and 20 to 22" in the other, depending on the original width of the fabric.
